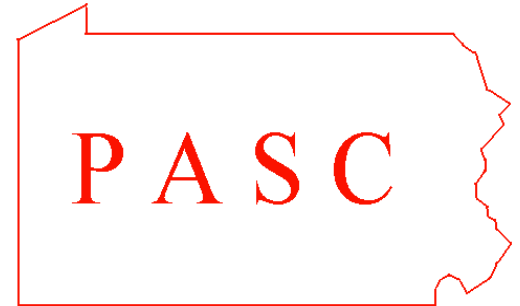


## How PASC Works

Our membership is comprised of center directors, managers, coordinators and other supporting staff. PASC is divided into 5 regions - Central, Northeast, Northwest, Southeast and Southwest. Each region has 5 members elected to serve a two-year term on the PASC Board of Directors. Ad hoc representatives are appointed as needed for proper representation on various committees. Committees include Public Relations, Membership, Legislative and Training/Professional Development.

The board meets four times a year to organize events, develop training and coordinate legislative efforts on behalf of the membership.

PASC representatives also present special events and trainings regionally to bring PASC members together in smaller groups.
